With 8 original members, we have had close to 900 join us as we enter our 35th year. It is mindboggling and proves we have been on the right path.

It actually started on July 18th at a Bill Kay Chevrolet Corvette show (then known as Liberty Chevrolet) planning meeting. The dealer staff, Larry Stortz and George Wronowski, invited us for drinks at a long-closed Bar (most things start in a bar) named Rosie O'Grady's. "Rosie's" was located close to the dealership on Ogden Ave. We came to the conclusion that what brought us together was the direction that we were setting for the Corvette show, our close relationship with Liberty Chevrolet and each other. We felt we had more in common on those points than we had with the direction being taken by our current club, Golden Glass Corvette Club. And that is how it started.

After calling the NCCC region membership director during the 8/8/1990 meeting and finding out what was required to start a new NCCC club, we

all pitched in money to get things moving.

The club was incorporated on 8/15/1990, our now recognized birthdate.

The first Board meeting was held on Wednesday (yes, a Wednesday) 9/12/1990 and our very first General meeting was held at Orland Bowl. the following Tuesday, 9/18/1990. We did pick up a couple of new members in late August.

Our first event, an NCCC Halloween Rallye, was hosted by Perry and Dawn Scarsellato, that started in Orland Park. The new Windy City Corvettes, inc. ended our first year of the NCCC Midwest Region Competition championship in 15th place.

### Fun facts:

Our first mailing address was 9222 W. 159th St, Suite 349, Orland Park, IL 60462.

Our first option for club colors were Blue and Orange. But that did not last as the Quartermaster convinced the Officers that Blue and Orange may be hard to match and that Black and Silver would be the best colors for long-term consistency. That original Quartermaster still holds firm on Black and Silver. :-) Skyline Corvette Club was considered for our club name.

The club grew steadily starting the next Spring due to the balance of NCCC events offered, a fun social environment that brought members together and a very successful Charity program. Who knows what the next 35 years will bring?

They work with hospitals, companies, schools, organizations, parents, etc. to help those with Spina Bifida become independent.

Kendra Jewelers is another partner of ISBA. They were there helping the kids make bracelets. They had hero capes for the little ones also.
